DELEGATE'S REPORT (Jane E)

.... welcome to Panel 69, trusted servants!

I registered on our website with my new position and service email. Hopefully we all have by now, I'm excited!

The theme of the 69th General Service conference is "Our Big Book- 80 years, 71 languages".

All languages the Big Book comes in are on the table. I wrote to GSO and got this final list and when I asked for it in Spanish, it hadn't been translated yet, but they did it within a week!

Throughout the rotation, I'll be sharing lots of information. Some live, some in our area email, via our website, some emailed to the officers and our alternate delegate will pass it on to the DCMCs to share with those they serve. Please help. It takes every single one of us to have an informed area.

I've received my committee assignments! I'm delighted to say that I've been assigned Treatment/Accessibilities! In addition to what's been included historically, the committee now covers underserved and remote communities, including the armed services.

Important to note is that this is one committee. The words "Special Needs" have been removed from the name. We may want to consider removing those words, too. It might be an idea, I've been at events where people who had accessibilities concerns voiced that the words "special needs" are insulting and condescending. Now, if we're trying to be accessible to all, I'm not liking starting off with an insult.

Long before I was assigned to this Conference Committee, I've been thinking about Accessibility in terms of digital fluency (or lack of it) and AA. How do we get the message to people who communicate mainly through digital media? How do we "step up" as AA members in carrying the message, do we really mean it when we say, "I am responsible, when anyone, anywhere, reaches out for help, I want the hand of AA always to be there, and for that, I am responsible"?

I'm one of the lucky delegates to receive a secondary committee assignment. (They must have known I'm from SENY and can handle two). My secondary Committee is International Conventions/Regional Forums. In reviewing history, I learned that a decade ago the committee asked when planning events, that districts, counties, and groups be mindful not to schedule them for a Forum weekend. May 31-June 2 is the Northeast Regional Forum, and we're hosting! The host contact is John W. Panel 67 SENY delegate.

Please bear in mind other events such as our Convention, NYSIW, NERAASA, and all SENY Assemblies when planning events to keep us inclusive (it will also help attendance at your events).

One thing we'll be working on is: "Discuss ways to encourage interest in Regional Forums and attract first-time attendees."

Spread the word that this is not for service people only, it's for all AAs! There's no registration fee and GSO comes to us. It's a great place to ask things like "what happens to our contributions?", or "What's the best way to run a business meeting in my group?" I call it the GSO road show.

Think about how to encourage others, try some of your ideas, and let me know what worked.

I'm asking for your help. It's my job to read like I've never done before (even in Nursing Pre-requisites). And I am. The idea is for the Area to be informed, and no one person can possibly give you all the information that we need to have an informed conscience. I invite you to read with me.
