Good morning / Buenos Dias – I have the joy to serve all of you as your alt delegate.

One of my jobs as your Alternate Delegate is to be your Area Inventory Steward. SENY typically holds an Area Inventory at the last Assembly of each rotation. As trusted servants, we try to keep the messages we received from you in front of us in the current rotation. You picked up a handout this morning about the one a year ago, complete with recurrent themes and an Action Plan.

I mentioned trusted servants a moment ago. There are around 35 Officers, DCMCs and Standing Committee Chairs listed on the back of your Links, with contact information. Additionally, there are roughly 50 active DCMs and Past Delegates that stand ready to serve you. These 85 or so people are your SENY Committee.

How do I know all these things? The SENY service handbook and service manual

Everyone here knows our Primary Purpose as alcoholics – we hear it at every meeting in the Preamble, as we heard it this morning. In addition, we know from the 5th Tradition what each Group's Primary Purpose is. But your SENY Committee has a Primary Purpose, too – it's to support our GSRs, by responding to the needs of you and your group. And if you've had any dealings with any of the Committee members, you know we take our jobs pretty seriously.

Back to the Inventory. I'd like you to notice a sentence in the first paragraph of the Action Plan: "It will be up to <u>all</u> of us in Panel 69 to determine any changes to be implemented". That's not all of us [indicate officers], that's all of us [the room]. Because we, the Committee serve you, the GSRs and your Groups. And to do that effectively, you need to communicate with us – specifically – as to how we can serve you.

A question for the GSRs: before today, how many of you had looked on the SENY website, under From the Delegate, at the contents of the Area Inventory, or for that matter, at the AA Communications Audit? The former is at

the heart of keeping SENY healthy and vibrant; the latter is the same thing, for all of AA. So we will continue to invite you to use the great resources – human, printed and electronic –which we do our best to provide you.

Do you need to know about the best piece of literature for a situation? Do you want to know how to find something on the SENY website? Would you like one of us to speak at your group, facilitate a group inventory, or just take the time to sit and answer your questions about General Service? The answer to all these questions is the same: ask us!

So, what part of the Area Inventory affects your Group, or impacts you? How can we <u>Support</u> you? What are your challenges with <u>Diversity</u>, <u>Accessibility and Inclusiveness</u>? How can our mutual <u>Communication</u> needs be updated, enhanced, or remedied?

We stand ready to serve you; all you have to do is ask.

I am – better yet, we are – available to facilitate Group and County Inventories, meetings or workshops on Traditions or Concepts. We would love to come visit your group. And beyond being available, we are excited, delighted and honored to be of any service we can to SENY, and to AA as a whole.
